Principals Message

Kia ora whānau

I want to take the opportunity this week to thank all of you for your support of our Staff Only Day last Friday. These additional teacher development days were negotiated as part of the teacher collective agreement last year and are an extremely valuable time for staff to be able to focus on professional learning and planning.

I would also like to thank you all for adapting so easily to the change in Alert Levels. As we may be at alert level 2 for a little while longer, here is a reminder of what Level 2 looks like:

- Children are to be dropped off after 8.30am.
- If your children are unwell with flu-like symptoms, please keep them at home to recover.
- We are taking a "drop at the gate approach" and are discouraging parents and caregivers coming on site.
- If you need to come onto the school site at any time, you must sign in and out on Vistab at the Office.
- Please download and use the NZ COVID Tracer App.
- Face coverings (Taken from yesterday's MOE update):

There is emerging international evidence that the use of masks and face coverings can reduce the risk of infected people spreading COVID-19. Masks and face coverings can be particularly useful if there is a risk of undetected community transmission and people are in close proximity to each other, or are unable to physically distance. Face coverings will therefore be **required on public transport** (buses, trains and commuter ferries) **from 11.59pm on Sunday 30 August**.

The key impact the new requirement will have on the school community is that **students aged 12 and above** will be required to wear a face covering when on **public** transport.

School transport is not included in this requirement. We know who is on school transport and have good systems in place to identify potential close contacts, should there be a case. Face coverings are not required in schools and early learning services at any alert level.

Any children, young people or teachers who wish to wear face coverings at schools or early learning services may do so if they want to.

On a brighter note. I am lucky enough to work in a cluster of schools that work very closely together, with some fantastic, hard working and very supportive principals. I would like to give you a quick update as to how Upper Hutt cluster of schools operate and what we hope to achieve.

Our cluster includes all primary, intermediate and secondary schools, as well Whānau Manaaki, our local kindergarten association. We work together towards our vision of *shaping our future through engaging learning pathways for nga ākonga (learners)*. We are focused on ensuring the best possible outcomes for students across our city.

We have a strategic plan for the cluster which has 3 key strategic goals with action points:

- 1. Develop agentic learners across the UH Cluster, with a focus on unpacking what is essential for all students to learn and how schools can work together to support our students as they transition through their education.
- 2. Having a resources model and plan that considers people, funds, time and their allocation across the cluster, working on bringing key resource groups together to support our students and the work of schools, developing processes around our recently appointed Learning Support Coordinators, and looking at how we can share and access resources to support our work.
- 3. Strengthen the capability of teachers and leaders within the UH Cluster which has a focus on providing quality professional learning opportunities for staff working in our schools across the cluster. This has included shared teacher only days and providing opportunities for our teachers and school leaders to learn alongside and from each other.

We are also focused on making sure our practices are culturally responsive for all members of our community. Our work was recently highlighted by the NZ Principals' Federation as a great example of schools collaborating together.

Part of our strategic plan is to ensure we keep our community informed of our work together. We are incredibly proud to be in such a collaborative, hardworking and innovative cluster and we know our students across all of our schools are benefiting from the dedicated and united approach to getting the best outcomes for our students.

Community Consultation - Health Education

Survey Reminder

Dear parents, caregivers and whānau

The Education Act (2001) requires schools to consult with their parent community every two years. During this consultation process, we outline our current health education programme and provide an opportunity for you to comment. This feedback helps guide our teaching and learning programmes.

"In health and physical education, the focus is on the well-being of the students themselves, of other people, and of society through learning in health-related and movement contexts". The New Zealand Curriculum p22

In the health education programme offered at Mangaroa School students are given the opportunity to develop their understanding of the factors that influence the health of individuals, groups, and society. This programme is covered in a two year cycle.

Regular physical activity is important, with additional opportunity to participate in inter school and inhouse sporting events. In terms one and four, students have the opportunity to learn aquatic skills in our swimming pool. Our students take part in visits and trips outside the classroom (due to Covid-19 this has been restricted this year). Senior students are given the opportunity to partake in camp and take on roles of responsibility. Puberty: My Changing Body is covered as a unit in the senior school an a biennial basis. The use of external providers is encouraged e.g. Life Education, Keeping Ourselves Safe, Dial 111. Parents are always informed and consulted prior to these units taking place.

The four strands covered by the health and physical education curriculum are:

- 1. Personal Health and Physical Development
- 2. Movement Concepts and Motor Skills
- 3. Relationships with Other People
- 4. Healthy Communities and Environments

There are seven key areas of learning to be included in teaching and learning programmes at both primary and secondary levels:

- 1. Mental Health
- 2. Sexuality Education
- 3. Food and Nutrition
- 4. Body Care and Physical Safety
- 5. Physical Activity
- 6. Sports Studies
- 7. Outdoor Education
